My Little General Conference a conference craft for kids!

Supplies needed:

- Scissors
- Exacto knife
- Glue stick
- Tape
- Black constuction paper
- Empty cardboard box
- Paper towel roll
- (or another long cylinder object)
- Printed illustrations & names

Instructions:

Print the following pages (there is a color and black & white option).

Cut out the names, pulpit, and all of the figures. Find a cardboard box you don't need (an empty cereal box is perfect) and cut a rectangle out of the front of the box to make it appear like the screen of a (cardboard) T.V.

Now, turn the cardboard box to the right side, take your exacto knife, starting at about 2 inches from the top going down, and cut an X (also about two inches from top to bottom) into that side of the box. Repeat this on the left side. Be sure to measure it so it's straight across from side to side. Once those are cut, stick your paper towel roll through the X's so that it's going through the box and out the other side. You should be able to see it through your "screen." Next take the pulpit cut-out and glue or tape it right behind the front of the "screen." You'll want this in front because later you'll have the prophet and apostles behind it in the back part of the your cardboard T.V.

Next take a piece of black construction paper (or any other dark color) and cut it in half horizontally (making it 6.9 inches). This will be the backdrop of the scene on the "screen." As you watch General Conference, pick the cut-out figure of the speaker and glue it near the bottom of the construction paper. Tape the first paper onto the roll inside - I suggest using strong tape, such as packing tape, otherwise it doesn't adhere to the roll very well. Tape the top of the next paper to the bottom of the first. Do this with each speaker, lining up the apostles and prophet in speaking order.

Find the name cut-outs and see if your child(ren) can match the name to the illustration.

As always, have lots of fun with this!

*Black & white version:

Have the child(ren) color the apostles and prophets during General Conference and cut them out later. You can make the T.V. as a family and review what the speakers taught as you add the illustrations to the roll.
